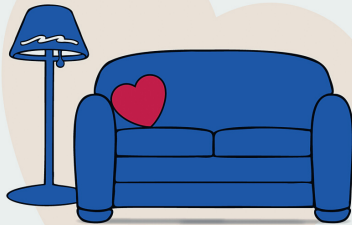

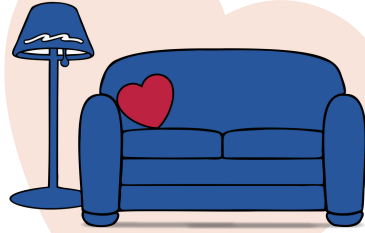

Our Vision

Strengthen the resiliency in women as they persevere in the face of adversity.

Our Mission

To ease adversity, promote stability, and support self-reliance for Sonoma County women and children who are experiencing, or at-risk of experiencing, homelessness.

What We Do

We work within four primary areas: housing, food, education and services to women and their children.

Our Strategies

Food: Expand our food service program in ways that support our participants and our community.

Outreach: Utilize The Living Room Life Center, our walk-in center on North Dutton Avenue, to provide whole-person wrap-around services that support women's independence and connection to our community.

Housing: Connect women and their children to permanent housing, while helping to identify and overcome life barriers. All of our housing units come with wrap-around services, mentoring, and ongoing support that lasts as long as it is wanted and needed.

2022 Significant Achievements

We work within four primary areas: housing, food, education and services to women and their children.



We opened an additional location in March of 2022. The Living Room Life Center is the only walk-in day center for women and children. An average of 61 new participants come to our Life Center each week.

62 - Women employed
46 - Women permanently housed
38 - Children permanently housed



The Secret Hope Kitchen served 26,669 meals.

Contracted by the Sonoma County District Attorney's Office, Victim Services Division to provide assistance and services to crime victims in Sonoma County.



The Living Room Center was designated as an official learning site for Sonoma State University.

We became a member of the Sonoma County Community Organizations Active in Disaster.



We have 47 partners that provide direct client services.

An average of 150 hours of whole-person training has been completed by each staff member.



Over the course of 2022 our solar panels produced 13.2 MWh of clean energy reducing our carbon omissions by 9.4 tons. That's enough energy to charge 1.14M phones!



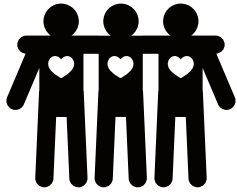

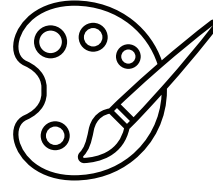

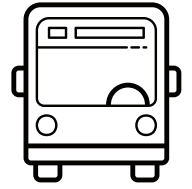

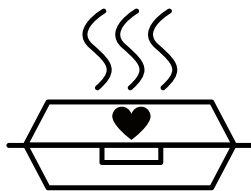

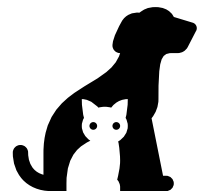

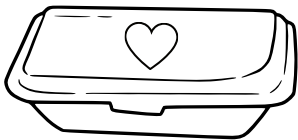

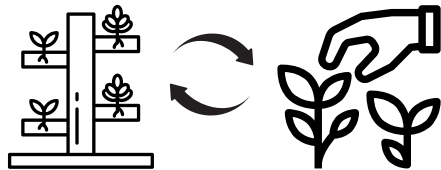

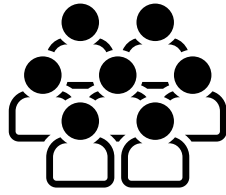

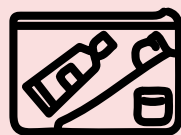
