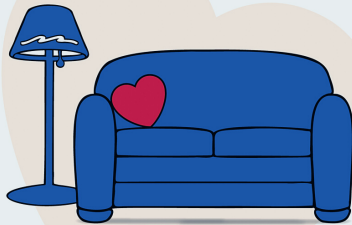

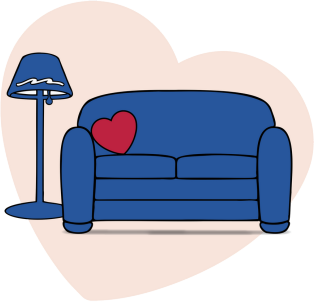

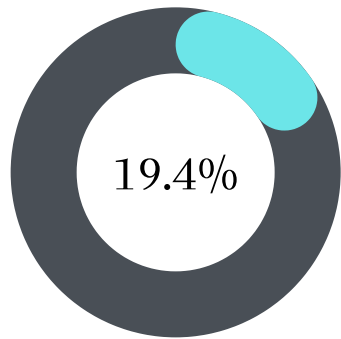
Due to the extreme global circumstances in 2021, Sonoma County homeless count was cancelled. The 2020 count reported 714 homeless women.



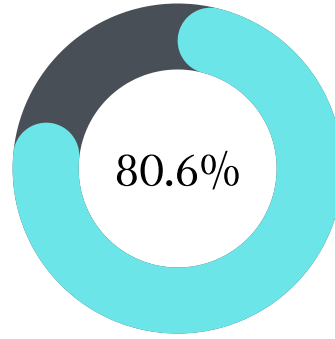
WHAT WE DO

MISSION INVESTMENT

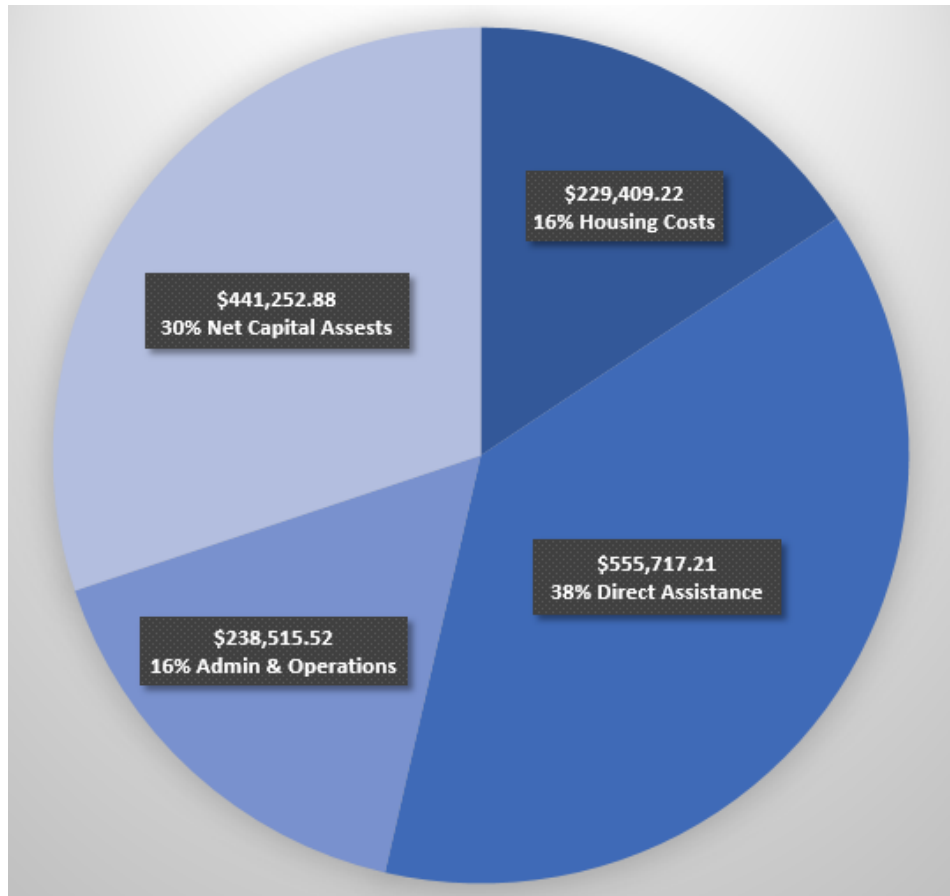


Admin Staff Costs

Pasta Carbonara

Carbonara is an Italian pasta dish from Rome made with eggs, hard cheese, cured porri and black pepper.



"Home Cooked" by The Living Room

Learn. Cook. Thrive.

"Home Cooked" by The Living Room brings cooking education to your home.

Learn - how to cook a nutritious meal, keep your food safe, and make your food last.

Cook - a delicious, healthy, well balanced meal using the tips and techniques provided.

Thrive - with the knowledge and practice in cooking that you obtain while providing a "Home Cooked" meal for you and your family.

- ### Ingredients
- 8oz Bacon (cut into strips)
 - 2 Eggs
 - 2 Egg yolks
 - 4oz Parmesan Cheese
 - 1/2 lb Dry Pasta (we used spaghetti)
 - 1tsp Salt
 - 2tsp Ground black pepper
 - 2tsp Herbs



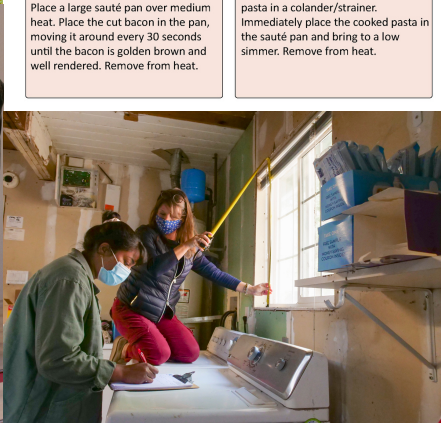
Step 1: Bring 2 quarts of salted water to a boil and cook pasta al dente according to directions on box (7-11 minutes depending on the type of pasta)

Step 2: In a small bowl combine your parmesan and eggs. Set aside.

Once the pasta is done transfer 1/2 cup pasta water to the sauté pan. Drain pasta in a colander/strainer. Immediately place the cooked pasta in the sauté pan and bring to a low simmer. Remove from heat.

Step 3: Working quickly add the parmesan/egg mixture to the sauté pan and stir with tongs or wooden spoon. Keep the egg mix moving until the parmesan has melted and the sauce is thick and creamy. (If your pan is too hot or you take too long mixing you can accidentally make scrambled eggs).

Step 4: Taste before you season the pasta, you may not need to add extra salt. Add black pepper and herb of your choice. I used chives. Parsley is another great option.

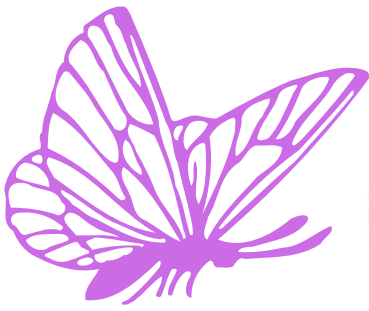

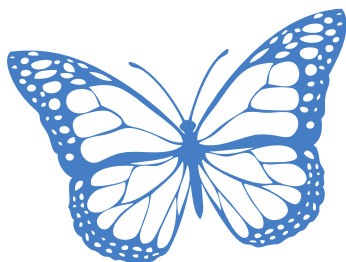

All Sonoma County women and their children are valued in the community; they are safe, have food and a home, and never have to spend a night unsheltered.

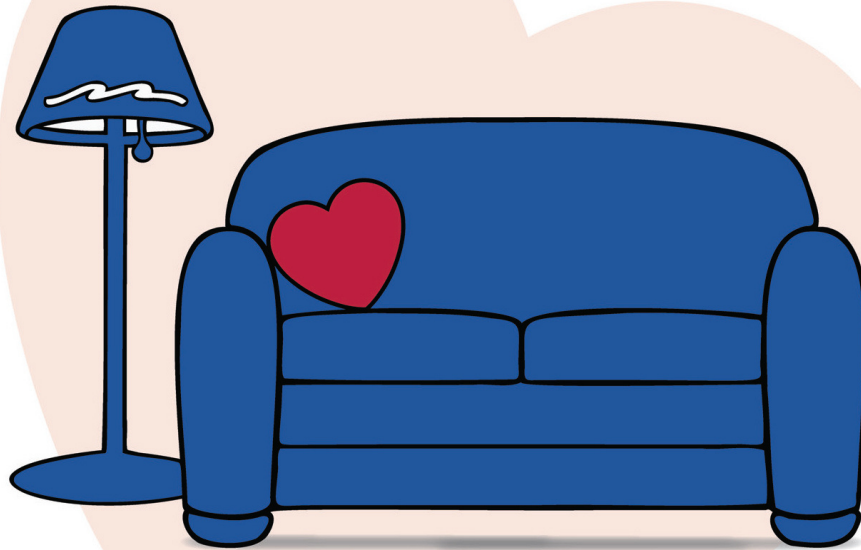
STRATEGIES

1) OUTREACH - Open The Living Room Life Center at 1335 North Dutton Avenue, to provide the appropriate space for a diverse set of outreach and wrap-around services.

2) FOOD SERVICE - Leverage and expand the current food service program to serve clients in need, and train clients at the Secret Hope Kitchen.

3) HOUSING - Increase our capacity and performance in the areas of housing, wrap around services and advocacy. Connect more women and their children with housing opportunities
